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### YEAR ONE: EXPLORE MAJORS AND OCCUPATIONS

- Explore your interests through coursework.
- Get to know your academic advisor and discuss options for majors (if you are exploring majors).
- Meet with Career Services to investigate occupations and begin a career plan.
- Create a resume and cover letter so they are ready to apply for opportunities.
- Get involved by volunteering on/off campus in the community or by participating in student organizations. Especially seek opportunities related to your career interests
- Consider getting a part-time job to develop skills and confidence and to supplement your income.

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- Keep your grades up and seek assistance (tutoring/professors) if needed.

## YEAR TWO: EXPLORE CAREER OPTIONS

- Meet with Career Services to review your career plan.
- Seek leadership opportunities in campus activities or work roles to add leadership experience to your resume.
- Conduct informational interviews with contacts in your field and begin developing new connections. - Maintain a strong GPA.
- Have your resume reviewed by Career Services.
- Research and consider completing an internship (usually non-credit) or part-time job related to vour intended career field.
- Continue to meet with academic advisors and make sure you are on track.

### YEAR THREE: GAIN EXPERIENCE THROUGH INTERNSHIPS

- Attend job fairs to network and to gain experience Consider the possibility of attending graduate and confidence in talking with employers.
- Try a mock (practice) interview.
- Work as an intern, preferably related to your chosen career field.
- Keep your resume and a general cover letter updated. You never know when you may need it.
- school and explore admission requirements and application steps.
- Meet with your advisor and make sure you are on track to graduate next year.
- Watch your grades to make sure you keep up your GPA.

# YEAR FOUR: IMPLEMENT YOUR CHOICES & NETWORK, NETWORK, NETWORK!

- Meet with Career Services to develop a job search strategy.
- Update and polish your resume one final time.
- Identify and target companies and organizations.
- **Perfect** your interviewing skills by participating in mock interviews.
- Have a "Dress for Success" outfit ready.
- **Connect** with the CUC LinkedIn alumni group.
- Consider a student membership in a professional association in your field.
- Review CCCIllinois Fall Interview Day participants/ positions and apply for those of interest (in Sept.).
- Attend CareerFest (run by CCCIllinois, usually in February) and bring plenty of resumes.
- Visit all job fairs and Career Services events. Upcoming events are posted on the bulletin boards and the Career Services section of the portal.
